We have Black Friday, Small Business Saturday, Cyber Monday, Giving Tuesday and heaven knows what else. Actually, heaven knows exactly what else. Here at Middleham and St. Peter's we not only do church, but we also do so many other wonderful ministries that touch the heart of so many people, including you. BUILDINGS AND GROUNDS

What has been done in 2018 at MSPP:



In 2018 we continued to implement one of the objectives of our Capital Campaign which was to make necessary repairs to the Chapels and the Parish Hall. It has been a very challenging year mainly due to the record rainfall which was more than 2 feet above normal. In addition to projects we had planned, additional effort was needed was maintain the properties. Thanks to your continued generosity we have been able to carry out that wish at each of the facilities this year. In addition to routine maintenance we have accomplished the following:

St. Peter's Chapel-

- Remediated mildew that was discovered due to the heavy rains
- Restore and paint the area behind the alter

Middleham Chapel-

- Replaced the deteriorating roof with period shaker shingles
- Inspected and repaired the bell tower
- Replaced some interior ceiling boards damaged by the roof leak
- Repaired interior cracks and water damage in the Sacristy, Vesting Room and alter area.
- Refinished the floor in the Sacristy
- Built and installed new cabinets in the Sacristy and Vesting Room to replace those damaged by moisture.

Parish Hall-

- Completed a major kitchen renovation. The kitchen renovation was completed with all volunteer help.
- · Replaced Refrigerator and Freezer with a generous donation in the memory Andy Miller
- Painted interior hallways and doors in the Parish Hall office area. This is an ongoing project.
- Began construction of a 14' by 20' shelter, which will provide a covered area for picnics and other outdoor activities. This is Eric Gronda's Eagle Project for Troop 1684.

Once again, we have had a very busy year. Over the past 2 years we have been working to find and fix the water leak leakage in the basement of the Parish Hall which has been occurring for over 10 years. With all the rain we've had this year I'm pleased to say that we had no leaks in the basement. Moving into 2019 we will continue to monitor the roof at St. Peter's and move more towards maintenance of the buildings instead of emergent repairs. Thanks again to everyone for their help and support in completing these much-needed projects.

White Privilege Workshop: Building Understandings and Relationships

On November 11, twenty-seven Blacks and Whites from MSP and the three local counties, successfully completed the White Privilege Workshop offered by Middleham and St. Peter's Parish and the Big Conversation committee. The workshop followed The United Church of Christ's curriculum "White Privilege – Let's Talk". This adult education curriculum is designed to invite participants to engage in safe, meaningful, substantive and bold conversations on race.

Participants were asked to come with "new eyes, ears and open hearts". That they did! Actively sharing and listening to each other's stories, they developed understandings for what daily life is like in the Black community. Seeing with "new eyes", we developed an understanding about the advantages that whites have daily. Advantages that one never thinks about. Taking an inventory of our personal weekly interactions with "the other" brought "aha's" from all involved. There was a realization that both races have work to do.



In the end, no one wanted to leave after the last session. We have created new friendships. We now realize that by not having more interaction with "the other" we were missing something of value in our lives. Thus, the group will continue to meet with a potluck supper in February.

As one participant wrote in the evaluation, "We have the chance to write a new and hopeful chapter in the narrative of race in this community. White people do not want oppression to be our narrative any more than black and brown people want to live in the system of oppression that defines our present age."

Progress and Challenges in Our Schools The Annual Big Conversation

The Annual Big Conversation is scheduled for Sunday, January 13, 2019 from 2:00 -5:00 pm. The focus for this civil dialogue is, **The Progress and Challenges in our Schools.** Due to the expected interest in the topic, the Big Conversation venue is the <u>Patuxent High School auditorium</u>. Doors will open for registration at 1:30 p.m.

The forum will consist of a panel discussion with a moderator, and small group sessions lead by trained facilitators. In the small groups, participants are invited to share their stories and give feedback to the superintendents of schools and the commissioners of each county regarding their experiences and suggestions. A summary paper will be transmitted to the State and the Southern Maryland community as well.

As always with the Big Conversations, the intent is to present the multiple points of view on issues. To this end the panel will include:

- **Daniel Curry**, Calvert County Schools Superintendent.
- **Dr. Janice Walthour,** St. Mary's NAACP President and longtime educator,
- **Guffrie M. Smith, Jr.**, Retired educator, native of St. Mary's County/ resident of Calvert County, with a diverse career including 33.5 years with Calvert County Public Schools and 6.5 years with the Maryland State Department of Education,
- Other panelists may include a member of the Closing the Gap Collation, a student and a county commissioner.

There is much discussion in the Southern Maryland community regarding perceived needs and challenges in the educational system in regards to: achievement, diversity, teacher hiring, equity, discipline, and adequate preparation of our students for the new world of work and as contributing, informed citizens. In addition, the official Maryland Commission on Innovation & Excellence in Education report, referred to as the Kirwan Report, will be delivered to the State early in 2019. This report, was commissioned Maryland General Assembly in 2016. It will become the blueprint for educational decisions and funding to the counties for the next ten years. Learn what the two school systems are initiating and what are the challenges. Learn what are DELT Teams, why is poverty such a problem in trying to close the GAP, why is it so difficult for our school systems to retain quality and diverse teachers? This Big Conversation on local education affects all of us: taxpayers, grandparents, parents, educators, students and businesses.



Materials will be provided. December 5th will cover Advent Week 1 pages 11-18.



As we get prepared for the harshness of winter it is important to remember a few things:



Get your Flu Shot! Also- check out the chart below:

- Remember to stay at home if you are sick, so that the flu does not spread.
- Keep plenty of tissues and fluids at home and ready for use and be sure to wash your hands frequently
- Call your physician as needed- if your temperature goes above 100.4, if the symptoms worsen or if they last more than 10 days

Is it a Cold or Flu?

Signs & Symptoms	Influenza	Cold

Fever	Usual	Rare
Aches	Usual	Slight
Chills	Fairly Common	Uncommon
Fatigue, weakness	Usual	Sometimes

At Home: Check your home for drafts- and try to minimize them.

Never use your oven for heat.

Install CO monitors especially near bedrooms.

If using a space heater- make sure it is good working order, check the wires for fraying, and do not use it while away or asleep.

In your car- have a first aid kit and emergency flashlight, blankets, water and snacks.


Keep your tires inflated as recommended by manufacture.




