One of my favorite verses from the New Testament is Romans 12:1-2. The J B Phillips translation renders it in these words.

With eyes wide open to the mercies of God, I beg you, my brothers (and sisters) as an act of intelligent worship to give him your bodies as a living sacrifice, consecrated to him and acceptable by him. Don't let the world around you squeeze you into its own mold, but let God remold your minds from within, so that you may prove in practice that the plan of God for you is good, meets all his demands and moves toward the goal of true maturity.

As we all begin the new year perhaps it is a time to reflect on the plan of God for us in 2018 which might move us toward true maturity. Joan Chittister in her book *The Gift of Years* has a chapter on forgiveness. She writes "There is a softening of heart that comes with age, not out of virtue so much as out of experience. By seventy, we not only know that no one is perfect, we know that no one can be. Not we, not they, not anybody. In fact, we learn as the years go by that life is nothing but a series of exceptions to be reckoned with, to be mediated, to be understood. There are no absolutes, and those who seek to make them so soon fall in the face of their own rigidities."

May 2018, with our eyes wide open to the mercies of God, be a time when we see afresh the real world around us. Brother Randy Greve from Holy Cross Monastery, who is my Spiritual Director, asked me in a recent conversation what is the ongoing conversion you are going through. Where am I letting God remold my mind so that I may prove in practice.....

My hope and my prayer is this year may be a time when I become more aware in the words of Thich Nhat Hahn, a Vietnamese Buddist monk, of Tiep Hien or interbeing. That I am connected to all of creation, all of creation, that to care for, to love, to respect all of creation is an act of worship and moves me toward God's sense of human maturity.

Conversation on Sunday, January 14, 2018 from 2-5pm is all about building bridges in our Southern Maryland Community. It is titled, "I Didn't Know...Exploring Racism and Privilege In Our Community." You are invited to come and be part of this community bridge building. Why, because racism does exist in Southern Maryland. It is not always very apparent or visible, but it is insidious in everyday life, and it keeps us from being a stronger community. Why, because living in Southern Maryland is not the same for Blacks and Whites, but we can each learn to do small things every day that can make it better for all of us. Why, because this fall several nooses were hung in various places in our community and such an environment cannot be tolerated. Why, because racism works against our Baptismal Covent call to love others in the power of the spirit and to strive for justice and peace among all people. On January 14, we will use dialogue and the sharing of our personal and collective stories to help in facilitating the healing, transformation and reconciliation that will make it possible for us to truly see the face of God in all others and create a Beloved Community.

What will the afternoon look like? It will begin with five local community leaders sharing their experiences and stories about racism and privilege in Southern Maryland. Then in small groups, led by trained facilitators, we will listen deeply to each other as we share our experience and stories. How often do we have an opportunity for Blacks and Whites to talk to each other, to share and understand our community and life experience? The groups will consider what needs to be done to dismantle racism, what we as individuals and a community can do, and what is being done already.

The three part Big Conversation started with the 6 week book study on, *Living into God's Dream: Dismantling Racism in America*. To our joy, 66 people from our parish and the community, Blacks and Whites, joined in conversation. By the end of the study, they had bonded in the belief that we could build bridges to dismantle racism. Then, 99 people attended the screening of the documentary 13th and the discussion. These two events helped educated us on racism and privilege in the nation and in our institutions. They also educated us on what is happening in places like the Diocese of Atlanta, which is successfully building understanding and dismantling racism. On January 14, The Big Conversation, we will learn about our own community.

Can you openly imagine what your role might be in building a Beloved Community? Can you envision how you might help dismantle racism? Join your community on January 14 at 2:00 and bring a friend, for a civil conversation with your neighbor on dismantling racism in our community.

We're trying something new!

This month, middle and high school youth will begin using the re:form youth ministry program on Sunday mornings. re:form is a question based program that seeks to give youth the tools for critical thinking, faithful reflection, and discovery. Each week we'll look at a question and explore it in depth. Anne Hayes and Rev. Sarah will lead these Sunday morning gatherings.

Here's a look at some of what we'll be asking this spring:

- Is the Bible true?
- If there is only one God, why are there so many different religions?
- Is the Holy Spirit a person or wind or fire or what?
- Why does God let bad things happen?
- Is God male?
- Is it okay to be angry at God?



We'll encounter a new question each week, engage in creative ways and then reflect on how we'd answer it given what we've learned. Intrigued by these questions and want to learn more? Talk to Rev. Sarah, or better yet, check in with our middle and high schoolers later this month to see what questions they've explored.


HeartFELT






Parish Health Ministry

Have a Healthy 2018!

From your Parish Health Team and the CDC Brighten the holidays by making your health and safety a priority. Take steps to keep you and your loved ones safe and healthy.



- 1. Wash hands often to help prevent the spread of germs. It's flu season. Wash your hands with soap and clean running water for at least 20 seconds.
- 2. **Bundle up to stay dry and warm.** Wear appropriate outdoor clothing: light, warm layers, gloves, hats, scarves, and waterproof boots.
- 3. **Manage stress.** Give yourself a break if you feel stressed out, overwhelmed, and out of control. Some of the best ways to manage stress are to find support, connect socially, and get plenty of sleep.
- 4. **Don't drink and drive or let others drink and drive.** Whenever anyone drives drunk, they put everyone on the road in danger. Choose not to drink and drive and help others do the same.
- 5. **Be smoke-free.** Avoid smoking and secondhand smoke. Smokers have greater health risks because of their tobacco use, but nonsmokers also are at risk when exposed to tobacco smoke.
- 6. **Fasten seat belts while driving or riding in a motor vehicle.** Always buckle your children in the car using a child safety seat, booster seat, or seat belt according to their height, weight, and age. Buckle up every time, no matter how short the trip and encourage passengers to do the same.
- 7. **Get exams and screenings.** Ask your health care provider what exams you need and when to get them. Update your personal and family history.
- 8. **Get your vaccinations.** Vaccinations help prevent diseases and save lives. Everyone 6 months and older should get a flu vaccine each year.
- 9. **Monitor children.** Keep potentially dangerous toys, food, drinks, household items, and other objects out of children's reach. Protect them from drowning, burns, falls, and other potential accidents.
- 10. **Practice fire safety.** Most residential fires occur during the winter months, so don't leave fireplaces, space heaters, food cooking on stoves, or candles unattended. Have an emergency plan and practice it regularly.
- 11. **Prepare food safely.** Remember these simple steps: Wash hands and surfaces often, avoid cross-contamination, cook foods to proper temperatures and refrigerate foods promptly.
- 12. **Eat healthy, stay active.** Eat fruits and vegetables which pack nutrients and help lower the risk for certain diseases. Limit your portion sizes and foods high in fat, salt, and sugar. Also, be active for at least 2½ hours a week and help kids and teens be active for at least 1 hour a day.



- Telephoning key parishioners and asking them to spread the word.
