

So What do Monks Do?



I will be in residence at Holy Cross Monastery; An Anglican Benedictine Community of Men, in West Park New York for four weeks starting the 9th of May. This the middle part of my three-month sabbatical. The question I am

often asked is besides praying five times a day exactly what will you be doing with all your time?

The rule of St. Benedict was established in 1223. St. Benedict describes it as "the book of life, hope of salvation, marrow of the Gospel, the way of perfection, the key of paradise, the covenant of an eternal alliance". The rule talks about the "duty of work, but doing it in a way that does not extinguish the spirit of prayer and devotion. I will have at least three options for work. One is helping maintain the garden. The monastery has a large organic garden which produces much of the vegetables used for their meals. The second option is assisting with tasks in the library, and finally, with the permission of the chef, working in the kitchen. I also have a number of books to read while I am at the monastery, several of them given to me by members of the parish.

Holy Cross has a large guest house and runs many workshops and seminars. I will be staying in a special section which is for long term residents. It is located in the under-croft of the church and consists of four bedrooms, a sitting room, a kitchen and a single bathroom. I will be cooking my own meals when the guest house is closed each week from Sunday through

Tuesday. When the guest house is open, I will be eating my meals with the monks and other guests.

Holy Cross Monastery was founded by the Rev. James Otis Sargent Huntington (1854-1935) in 1884 in New York City. Its focus was on helping the poor and desolate of the lower east side of the city. It briefly moved in the 1890's to Westminster, Maryland, and to its present location in 1902. In addition to its worship life the monks continue to be involved with social ministries in the West Park community.

What will the Vitality Team be doing?

Taking the recommendations of the March workshop and preparing a six-month action plan to reintroduce the church to the community, redirecting activities to provide opportunities for inviting the community, and getting all of our ministries to have an outward focus.

As our coach Paul Nickerson advised us, the team's long term goals are:

- ❖ For our team to be the "catalyst" to involve all of the congregation in reaching new people.
- ❖ To make reaching new people a permanent ministry of the parish
- ❖ To focus on getting out in the community, meeting people, building relationships, and inviting, picking up and bringing new folk to worship with us. This is a long-term culture change for us.
- ❖ To see lives changedm spiritually enriched and communities transformed.

As part of the workshop Paul Nickerson and Jim Griffith did a hospitality audit of each of the worship spaces on Sunday, March 5. They provided a set of recommendations for us, which the clergy and team will be working on. One immediate step was to get new signs for the Middleham campus and parish hall, identifying us as an Episcopal Church. There are now two new signs as you enter the drive toward the Parish Hall. About Our Labyrinth

The following provides you with information about the labyrinth at the Middleham campus of Middleham and St. Peter's Parish.

What is it? It is a large (100' in diameter) walking path. The "Sacred Labyrinth Walk" is the ancient practice of "Circling to the Center" by walking the labyrinth. Labyrinths have been in use for over 4000 years. Their basic design is fundamental to nature and many cultures and religious traditions. Walking the labyrinth clears the mind and provides an opportunity for prayer. (see Sacredwalk.com)



Most popular with churches is the Chartres Cathedral labyrinth pattern. It originated in the early Middle Ages specifically to incorporate Christian meaning and symbolism. The most elegant and best-known version of the Medieval pattern is the one found in Chartres Cathedral, France. It was built in 1201 and still going strong, Our labyrinth is identical in size and design to the Chartres labyrinth. It includes 1100 stones setting out the path, with white stones showing where to turn. The path itself is grass. (see labyrinthproject.com)

Where is it? It is located to the east of the cemetery and just to the north of the

new columbarium. So you can access it by walking from the back parking area of the parish hall on the concrete sidewalk. Then just go to the other side of the tree. Or just walk across from Middleham Chapel. You will see the plaque marking the start. (see photo below) The photo to the right was taken by Paul Fuller with his drone camera.





Who made it? Our labyrinth was constructed in 2008 by the Journey to Adulthood – Young Adults in Church group. Group mentors were Nancy Warren and John Wilson and the youth were Mason Garland, Hannah Batong, Rachel Beck, and Jamie Truitt.


Adult Christian Formation

New Outreach Initiative Reading Camp


