

### The Isle of Iona

Some of the oldest rock on the face of the earth is on the Isle of Iona. While the island is only a mile and half wide and three plus miles long it has been known for the last 1,500 years as a thin place between heaven and earth. From the earliest histories we have of the island, it is a place where humans and God have encountered each other in a special way. These encounters have been in the form of monastic experiences and worship in community. Some of the encounters are found in the landscape of the island. Whether these are on the beaches of the island or in highlands and swamps that cover the island, each environment provides a window, an opportunity, for an individual to gather new insights about how God's will can be done on earth like it is in heaven.

Bruce and I will be spending the month of October on the Isle of Iona. This is the final part of a three-month sabbatical. We will be living in a cottage about a half mile outside of the village. There will be times to worship with the Iona Abbey Community, and at Bishop House, the Scottish's Episcopal Church retreat House. There will be times for quiet reflection and reading. Also, time for hiking all the various parts of the island.

As preparation for the month, I am reading Richard J. Woods book, *The Spirituality of Celtic Saints*. He writes about the enduring Celtic issues of social justice, the place women have in Celtic life and spirituality, and the ecology and the value of the natural environment. Surprisingly, he also addresses the dual characteristics of the art of blessing and and cursing in the Celtic tradition.

I look forward to the Isle of Iona being a thin place for me during the month of October and sharing some of my experiences with all of you when I return.

By using Vanco, you can easily separate your pledge into various funds. For example, I use the pledge line, the building fund line, and the BGM line to spread out the amounts I want to give for each of those areas. To use Vanco, change, update your pledge, or first time users need to create an account, follow these steps.

- 1. Visit our church website at <u>www.middlehamandstpeters.org</u>
- 2. Click on the **Giving** button.
- Follow the on screen instructions to login and schedule your recurring giving, make changes to your amount or create an online profile.

4. Then you can make your giving selections or click edit and change what you wish to update for your 2018 giving. It's pretty easy, even for non-computer types like me. As always, if you need help, just call or visit the church office to let me know, and I will help in any way I can. Thank you for your continue support to me, as your vestry treasurer, and always to MSP!



### A Civil Discussion: All are Welcome!

In the September Connector, the Big Conversation committee outlined their progress in developing the 6<sup>th</sup> Annual Big Conversation. The general topic is white privilege and its role in racism in America and Southern Maryland.

This topic requires more than one Sunday to digest and understand. Therefore, this year's Big Conversation will be presented in graduated steps, allowing all of us to look at various aspects of the national problem before we address the topic in the context of our home-Southern Maryland

*Living into God's Dream: Dismantling Racism in America* by Dr. Catherine Meeks. Offered in two formats,\* both are open to all:

"Living into God's Dream: Dismantling Racism in America," is a collection of essays by 8 writers edited by Dr. Catherine Meeks (136 pages). The eight writers featured in *Living into God's Dream* have spent years working to heal the wounds of racism. The essays weave together psychological, sociological, and theological threads, creating a body of work that will help readers reflect on their own journey as a White person or as a person of color. The book is available online from <u>Church Publishing</u>, Amazon (book and Kindle formats), and other retailers.

- 4) <u>Resources:</u> Following each week's discussions, a list of additional readings and resources will be published on the Big Conversation part of the parish website.

### Step 2: Screening of the film, "13th" and discussion

### December 3rd at 2:00 p.m in the Parish Hall.

"13<sup>th</sup>" is an award-winning film/documentary about race and mass incarceration. Named after the 13th constitutional amendment, which abolished slavery except as "punishment for crime," the documentary uses archival footage and expert commentary to make the case that slavery hasn't disappeared from the U.S.—it's evolved into our modern system of mass incarceration. This documentary addresses other practices and issues connected to racism and privilege that began soon after the abolishment of slavery in America. The committee hopes in establishing this background, we will all be better prepared to open our minds and hearts to a civil conversation concerning racism and privilege in our own communities with the annual BIG CONVERSATION event on January 14 at 2:00 pm.

## **Calvert County Homeless Shelter**

ECHO House is Calvert County's homeless shelter. Located in Prince Frederick, it is a non-profit ecumenical organization supported by over 20 Calvert County churches. Since 2003, we have provided the evening meal on the fourth Monday of every month. Many parishioners, individually or in groups – including our youth groups – have fixed meals.

Meals can be simple – a casserole or soup, or it can be a meat-starch-vegetable meal. Generally a dessert and a gallon or two of some sort of juice or milk are included. What complicates the meal is that there typically are about 40 residents in the shelter. It is becoming common for two or three families to get together to do a meal. Thanks to a grant from the Endowment Fund, \$40 can be reimbursed per month to someone making a meal.

# **Parish Health Ministry**

We first wish to thank the many volunteers that helped with our 8<sup>th</sup> Annual Health Fair. The turnout was modest, but good results came about. Four people signed up for health care insurance that didn't have it before; two people were found to have pulmonary

issues that need follow-up; 5 bikes were given to children that really wanted them; and 1 child's car seat was made safe. These are just a few of the successes.

In August, we were happy to have @16 people come from our parish and 2 other churches to hear Dr. Kim Goring speak about "Sleep"- something we all need and only a few seem to get enough of. Here are some of her "Rules to Improve Insomnia and Promote a More Restful Sleep" for those who could not attend:

- Sleep as long as necessary to feel rested (usually 7-8 hours for adults)
- Maintain a regular sleep schedule, particularly a regular wake-up time in the morning
- 4 Try not to force sleep
- 🖊 Avoid caffeinated beverages after lunch
- 🖊 Avoid alcohol; near bedtime
- 🖊 Avoid smoking or other nicotine intake late evening
- Adjust the bedroom environment as needed to decrease stimuli (reduce ambient light, turn off the TV/radio, etc.)
- Avoid prolonged use of light-emitting screens- laptops, smartphones, ebooks, etc.) for at least 30 mins. before bedtime
- Resolve concerns/worries before bedtime- write them down to help dismiss them)
- 4 Avoid daytime naps, especially longer than @20 mins. or later in the day


